Blocking Web Sites in Internet Explorer

You can block web sites in Internet Explorer by turning on the Content Advisor. However, there are many other free browsers that can be downloaded from the Internet. Settings in Internet Explorer will not block web sites accessed by other browsers; they must be blocked either using settings in that browser or purchasing parental controls software.

To block a web site in Internet Explorer:

- 1. Click on **Tools** and then **Internet Options**.
- 2. Click on the **Content** Tab
- 3. Under the heading "Content Advisor", click Enable
- 4. Click on the Approved Sites tab
- **5.** In the "Allow this site" box, type in the site you wish to block. (Example: www.myspace.com)
- **6.** Click the **Never** button
- 7. Click the **OK** button
- 8. You will be asked for a password. If you just entered Content Advisor, you must create a password. Enter a password in the Password input box and then retype it in the Confirm Password input box. This can be any password you want but be sure to remember it. You will not be able to change Content Advisor settings or override any web sites you blocked without this password. You can optionally enter a hint in the space provided but make sure the users you want to block do not know the hint.
- **9.** After entering the passwords, Click **OK**
- **10.** If a message appears about Content Advisor being enabled, Click **OK**
- **11.** Click **OK** to exit the Internet Options.
- **12.** If you attempt to enter the blocked site, a popup will appear saying the site has been blocked. Typing in the password you set in Step 8 above will allow you to view the site.
